Year 3/4 Autumn 1

Topic: North America and Mountains

Welcome back everyone! I hope you have had a wonderful summer break and are now ready for the start of a new school year. We have lots of exciting things to learn about and it will be wonderful to explore these topics with all of you. I am looking forward to getting to know our new Year 3 class more this year, as well as continuing our learning journey with the familiar Year 4 children.

Our topic for this first half-term is "North America and Mountains". In this topic, we will be exploring the continent of North America, its countries and looking deeper at the landscape and structure of The Rocky mountains. This topic will be explored further in other subjects, such as Art where we will practice using watercolours to paint mountain landscapes. We will also be looking at the importance of E-Safety in our Computing sessions, whilst our PE topic for this half term is invasion games and we will be looking at building healthy relationships in PSHE. In RE, we will be building on our prior learning of the Creation Story. In Science, we will be looking at what nutrients animals need to survive, as well as the structure of the skeleton in invertebrates and vertebrates.

In Maths, we will be consolidating our knowledge of addition and subtraction, before exploring number and place value with up to 4-digit numbers. Additionally, we will begin our focus on times-tables and embedding our knowledge of familiar tables such as 2, 4, 5 and 8x. It would massively benefit your progress if this could also be a focus at home, as well as using TTRockstars as often as possible. In English, we will start off by recapping some grammar and spelling rules, before moving onto learning about myths and writing our own. Later this term, we will be writing fact files about the Rockies and looking at poetry linked to mountains and North America.
