



Topic: People & Places
How did WW2 affect our local area?

Happy new year and welcome back to the new term! This half term we will continue learning about World War Two with a local area focus, learning about how our local area including Hull was affected and developing our history and geography skills to learn more. In Design Technology we will be learning about food and preparing recipes and in Art we will study the work of Henry Moore including charcoal sketches from WW2 and sculpture and developing our drawing skills. In Science, we will be learning about materials and their properties including learning about states of matter and reversible and irreversible changes to materials. In RE, we will be learning about Judaism including what Jewish people believe, how they worship, looking at different holy texts and the impact of these beliefs. We will be improving our chromebook skills and learning programming skills in our computing sessions. In PE, we will be working on gymnastics and dance this half term and we will be looking at respecting ourselves and others and relationships in PSHE.

In Maths, we will continue improving the accuracy of our calculation skills using all four operations and beginning to calculate using fractions and mixed numbers. Alongside this, we will be practising basic skills including addition facts and times tables to make sure our recall of number facts and mental calculation skills support our learning; practising these at home and regularly using TTRockstars would be really helpful. In English, we will be developing our sentence level skills and writing a range of texts inspired by our topic work as well as our reading texts. You can support at home by encouraging your child to use Lexia for reading and Spelling Shed to practise spelling rules.
